Job Purpose

- To work as part of the safeguarding team within MASH and Education, and to work closely with the Lead Safeguarding Adviser to provide advice and expertise on all safeguarding children matters for all children's Educations needs and welfare.
- To demonstrate a high level of expertise in relation to the safeguarding of children and promote the
 wellbeing of children and respond in line with Working Together To Safeguard Children (2018) in order to
 put the child at the centre of safeguarding.
- To consider and use the Education guidance Keeping Children Safe in Education (2018)
- To work to support practitioners to deliver a service that improves outcomes for vulnerable children and families.
- To be a substantive part of the safeguarding team in the Swindon multi agency safeguarding hub (MASH)
 as the lead Education representative, linking the different areas of Education provisions within the
 MASH.
- To contribute to timely, robust and consistent risk assessments of information gathered and shared across the agencies within the MASH. This will enable the proportionate, necessary and lawful disclosure of information at the earliest opportunity.
- To participate in strategy discussions and share relevant information to enable robust decision-making.

Key Accountabilities

- To contribute to the provision of training and audits and the ongoing development of standards of care and research including the development of policies, procedures and guidelines in relation to safeguarding children, and any other work streams relevant to the protection of children.
- Develop and maintain relationships with a broad range of internal and external stakeholders. Specifically Education professionals from a wide range of services and disciplines.
- Role model, promoting good practice and effective communication between all agencies, sharing proportionate information in accordance with GDPR requirements (2018).
- To provide professional challenge as necessary to ensure the child is kept the focus of any safeguarding work.
- Working with the Lead Safeguarding Adviser to ensure that relevant new national and local guidance, policies and procedures are disseminated.

- To ensure that new policies and procedures are developed in accordance with new legislation, statutory guidance and recommendations from serious case reviews.
- To work with professional leads in developing high standards of practice in relation to the management of vulnerable children and their families.

Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub

- Screening and Triage of all referrals from Education practitioners from across the Education workforce in Swindon to ensure the correct Swindon LSCB thresholds are being applied.
- To monitor and feedback to the Lead Safeguarding Adviser the performance and practice of Education
 practitioners in Swindon and ensure their safeguarding practices are linked to referring to MASH when
 required.
- To organise and collate the information gathering exercise linked to referrals to ensure a full and rich source of information is available to inform the decision making process.
- To provide a summary and recommendation for the next course of action within the joint decision making forum using the agreed processes and procedures.
- To disseminate the MASH outcome for specific children to all relevant Education practitioners including the referrer.
- To ensure that the agreed Quality Assurance programme is delivered for MASH work by completing audits and reviewing outcomes on selected cases and collaborating with colleagues in MASH to ensure a whole systems approach takes place.
- To ensure a robust Education provision is available at the MASH operational meeting and to work as part of a co-located team of professionals to deliver an integrated service with the aim to research, interpret and determine what is proportionate and relevant to share.
- Work collaboratively with the workforce leads in Education services to ensure that early intervention and prevention are prioritised rather than a focus on referral escalation.
