Job Purpose

The post holder will be responsible for providing specialist professional repair & maintenance expertise by utilising qualified surveying expertise to minimise Swindon Borough Council's liability to housing legal disrepair claims.

Excellent customer service is a prerequisite as tenants who are in the disrepair process may have endured distress. The outcome required is ensuring properties are maintained or returned to the standard and quality required by the Council's policies. The post holder will ensure comprehensive supervision of work delivered by DLO operatives and/or third party contractors, including liaison with repairs managers and supervisors, such that the resolution of the disrepair is effective.

Key Accountabilities

- Have extensive knowledge of the legal process of disrepair and the triggers that would invoke disrepair actions.
- Undertake detailed and as required invasive investigations into the causes of disrepair in residents' homes.
- Have professional expertise and knowledge to provide a building pathology assessment of defects to specify and rectify faults, whilst reducing the Council's liability to legal claims through implementation of risk management and assessment.
- Instruct, guide and direct DLO operatives and /or contractors, and internal stakeholders as necessary.
- Deliver professional surveys; prepare schedules and reports with effective financial appraisals.
- Seek to reflect enhancements to the Repairs service as an outcome of the resolution of disrepair cases.
- Act as the service expert in the use and delivery of devices, aids and instruments for the purpose

- of making assessments and diagnosis of building failures, specifically damp.
- Proactively challenge the recommendations made by Single Joint Experts in order to best represent the Council's interests.
- Devise and deliver appropriate training to improve professional competence within the Repairs team.
- To represent Swindon Borough Council as required in court.
- Play a lead role in case settlement, making informed recommendations to management regarding financial settlements in conjunction with legal colleagues.
- Deliver financial savings to the council by defending actions and identifying effective innovative repair solutions.
- Build and manage a professional working relationship with legal colleagues.
- Ensure compliance with statutory health & safety legislation and in accordance with the Council's responsibilities on all sites where repairs and maintenance is being undertaken in relation to works associated with disrepair.
- To produce management reports on the status of disrepair cases and maintain appropriate records, that include costs of work, completion timescales, legal costs and the DLO's performance on completing work to contract specifications.
- Work with surveyors involved in capital and maintenance projects to ensure coordination of design activities and work packages and make recommendations for planned repair work that could prevent a reoccurrence of disrepair in similar situations.
- Respond to all correspondence and telephone calls from all stakeholders within set timescales with respect to disrepair enquiries.
- Ensure all works are procured and delivered in accordance with the Swindon Borough Council Financial Regulations. Control costs and report any significant variations to the management team.
- Ensure a high level of tenant satisfaction is achieved.
- Manage and authorise work orders, payment certifications and variations including negotiating schedules of rates, resolve invoice disputes and contractual claims and approving payments for completed works.

Supplementary Accountabilities

- Promote locality working
- Promote customer care, equality and diversity best practice
- The post holder must have a passion for seeing that continuous improvement is a constant aspect of the working environment
- Work to agreed performance targets to ensure efficient and effective working practices
